

July 6, 2010 - Medically Fragile Students

The Missouri Legislature in the budget process for the 2010-2011 school year appropriated funds to offer free MoVIP classes to students who have been designated as medically fragile and cannot attend school due to this condition.

To be considered, an [application](#) must be completed and faxed to the MoVIP office at 573-522-1134 by August 13, 2010.

Basic information about this group of students:

1. The medically fragile seats in MoVIP are not for temporary medical conditions (six weeks or less)
2. Students who apply and are accepted into the medically fragile program are expect to participate for an entire semester.
3. If sufficient funds are not available to meet demand, priority will be given to medically fragile students who absolutely cannot attend school for medical reasons.
4. If the number of qualified medically fragil students exceeds resources, selection will be made by lottery.
5. Interested students who do not qualify as medically fragile and those not chosen in the lottery, may attend MoVIP by paying tuition.

Students will be able to take six classes per semester under this program.

Registration Process

- ◆ If returning student—utilize previous ID and password
- ◆ If a new student—create an ID and password
- ◆ Complete all demographic information on application
- ◆ Select courses (fall & spring terms) (start dates)
- ◆ Final step is to PAY the online vendor directly

State funded seats for students designated as medically fragile

- ◆ State budget does provide funds for a limited number of free seats for these students
- ◆ Application process—(application is at www.movip.org)
- ◆ Does require a physicians documentation/signature
- ◆ Fax to MoVIP at 573-522-1134 by August 13

School Districts can now use their own teachers

- ◆ RSMo 161.670 requires Mo. certificated staff
- ◆ Offering to lease some MoVIP courses (including courseware, LMS and staff development) to districts at a reduced cost
- ◆ MoVIP courses have been evaluated by Mo. educators to validate quality and alignment
- ◆ Another option to assist local school districts in the implementation of online delivery options

Two Missouri statues affecting virtual education

- ◆ *Missouri Revised Statute 162.1250*—Allows Missouri public school districts to offer instruction in a virtual setting outside of the regular school district facility and receive state aid for that class. If the school district offers its own class, contracts and pays for a class from MoVIP or another online provider, the district will collect state funds similar to what it would for a student attending a class in the brick and mortar setting. While this statue allows school districts to collect state aid, it does not require school districts to offer online classes.
- ◆ *Missouri Revised Statute 167.121*—Gives parents or guardians of a student who is a resident in an unaccredited or provisionally accredited Missouri school district the right to request the child's enrollment in MoVIP (section 161.670), provided the pupil first enrolls in the school district of residence. The district would pay the MoVIP tuition for the student to take the classes. School districts are not required to provide computers, equipment, Internet or other access, supplies, materials or funding.

MoVIP is a program designed to assist Missouri students

- 1.) Focus is to provide online courses and award credit
- 2.) MoVIP does not grant diplomas but instead transfers the credits to the local school districts
- 3.) Encourage you to work with your local school district.
